Today is the beginning of Advent, a time of preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth. We are here because God's promises to our ancestors came true when Jesus was born. God's promise is kept each Sunday when we worship because Christ is in our midst. God will keep the promise to come again in glory. In the ancient world, various peoples lit fires to mark the turning of the light into winter's season and to pray for the return of the light. The church has Christianized that practice in the lighting of the Advent wreath. These candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait in the Holy Spirit for Christ's coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer.

First Sunday of Advent: The Candle of Hope

Isaiah 60:2 says:

For night shall cover the earth, and thick shadows the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and God's glory will appear over you.



Lighting of the Advent Candle

We light this candle to proclaim the coming of the light of God into the world. With the coming of this light there is hope. Because of Christ we not only have hope, but we believe that good is stronger than evil. God wants us to work for good in this world.

The colour of this candle is purple—symbolizing the majesty of Christ, whose glory shines in the night.

Light the first candle: (Let us pray)

O God, we thank you that Jesus brought hope into our world. By the good news of the Bible you are still bringing hope to people. Help us to be ready to welcome Jesus Christ, so that we may think good thoughts and do good deeds and so we may be a people of hope in our world. Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit. **Amen**



Almighty God to whom all hearts are open all desires known and from whom no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen



If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

Let us confess together:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father in penitence we confess that we have sinned against you through our own fault in thought, word, and deed and in what we have left undone. For the sake of your Son, Christ our Lord forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name.



May the Lord of light and love forgive you your sins and set you free from them, may he strengthen you toward every Christian virtue, in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer

Merciful God, we pray for those for whom the season of Christmas will be a long and lonely one. Especially, we pray for the elderly; those whose children are far away; we pray for the widowed and recently bereaved; and for all those for whom Christmastime raises painful memories and associations. May they know the consolation of your love as well as your healing power. We pray especially for those who will pass away during the season for Advent, and for those whose year's mind occurs today.

Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer

Loving God, we pray for all those who are ill or suffering at this time. In your salvation, we have true healing, in body, mind, and spirit. Look into the hearts of all those in need of your healing, Lord Jesus; extend to them your healing touch, relieve them from their pain and discomfort, and grant them your peace which surpasses all understanding.
