Help us not to live for ourselves but to seek the good of our neighbour and those around us and, especially, of those less privileged than ourselves.

Gracious Father, your love is a perfect love expressed in the sacrifice of your Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. May we be able to love and to serve one another, and so abide in your commandments. Thereby may our joy be complete.
