Introduction

Today is the beginning of Advent—the time of preparation for the celebration of Christ’s birth. We are here because God’s promises to our ancestors came true when Jesus was born. God’s promise is kept each Sunday when we worship because Christ is in our midst. God will keep the promise to come again in glory. In the ancient world, various peoples lit fires to mark the turning of the light into winter’s season and to pray for the return of the light. The church has Christianized that practice in the lighting of the Advent wreath. These candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait in the Holy Spirit for Christ’s coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer.

First Sunday of Advent: The Candle of Hope

Isaiah 60:2 says:

*For night shall cover the earth, and thick shadows the peoples;
but the Lord will arise upon you, and God’s glory will appear over you.*

Lighting of the First Candle

We light this candle to proclaim the coming of the light of God into the world. With the coming of this light there is hope. Because of Christ we not only have hope, but we believe that good is stronger than evil. God wants us to work for good in this world.

The colour of this candle is purple— symbolizing the majesty of Christ, whose glory shines in the night.
