#### Thanks be to God

Today is Christmas, the day on which we celebrate the gift to us of the birth of Jesus and recall the hope we have in Christ. Today we light our last candle to remember the birth of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ which we celebrate this Christmas Day.

#### Luke 2

And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' (NRSV)
