
- 1 O Lord you were gracious to your lands: You restored the fortunes of Jacob.

We now come to a time of intercession.

Lord of heaven and earth, your word reminds us that you are not confined to temples made by human hands. In these ever-trying times where people are still unable to physically gather as they used to, may you make your presence known to them wherever they may be, and in whatever spaces and places they choose to dedicate to you in prayer and praise.

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.



You have commanded us Lord to be holy. This Lent, in our efforts to follow your example, we pray that you would guide us and that your grace would be sufficient for us. Strengthen our resolve to serve you better, Lord, and to love our neighbours as ourselves. We pray that you would save us from self-righteousness and from viewing Lent as the pursuit of moral perfection. Teach us then, Lord, what it means to be holy.

Lord of life and love, as a community and as a society we have endured much trauma and disruption in the last year. Pain and loss have become familiar to many Lord, and so we commit into your hands our own healing, as well as that of our communities. Grant us the courage and honesty to admit our pain to one another so that, through mutual love and support, we may be, with Christ, the wounded healers we are called to be.

God of abundant life, your Son, in his earthly ministry saw the failings of the established religion to provide for the material and spiritual needs of its people. May we too be spurred on by righteous anger when those in power fail to protect the vulnerable. We ask forgiveness for the Church's complicity in failing to care for these "little ones" and ask you to help us renew our own mandate in working towards justice, healing and peace.

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

God of comfort and compassion, we continue to commit into your hands the bereaved and grieving. In their loss, may they know your love and peace, gracious Lord, and may they find solace in your presence. We commit into your hands those who have faithfully departed, as well as those who may pass away during this Lent. May they ultimately know your love and compassion and may they enjoy the light of your countenance.

and all your day be bright."


I looked to Jesus, and I found
