
Celebration of the Lord's Passion

GENERAL INTERCESSIONS

Let us pray for the Holy Church of God that our God and Lord will preserve it in peace throughout the whole world; and that we, leading a quiet and peaceable life, may glorify the Creator of heaven and earth.

Almighty and everlasting God, in Christ you have revealed your glory among the nations: preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church throughout the world may persevere, with steadfast faith, in the confession of your Name; through Jesus Christ.

Lord in your mercy **Hear our prayer.**

Let us pray for all bishops, priests and deacons, and especially Thabo our metropolitan, Steve our Bishop, Moses, Matthew, Sharmain, Alison and Margaret, our priests that God would clothe them with wisdom and fill them with the Holy Spirit. Let us pray also for this congregation that God would make us a royal priesthood, a holy nation, to the glory of Christ Jesus.

Let us pray for those in tribulation and special need for those weighed down with sickness or any trouble; for those who are in prison and captivity for the name of the Lord: that God would deliver them from every illness and disease, open the prisons, loose their chains, and restore them sound into the holy Church.

Almighty and ever-living God, the comfort of the sorrowful, the strength of those who suffer: hear the prayers of your children who cry out in any tribulation; that all may rejoice, having known your merciful love in their time of need;

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Almighty and ever-living God, who bestowed your promises on Abraham and Sarah and their descendants: bless the children of your covenant, both Christian and Jew; take from us all blindness and bitterness of heart, and hasten the coming of your kingdom, when Israel shall be saved, the Gentiles gathered in, and we shall dwell together in mutual love and peace

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Let us pray for all our brothers and sisters who believe in Christ that our Lord and God may be pleased to regard not our sins, but the faith of the Church, and would grant peace and unity to all Christian people.

Almighty and everlasting God, you gather the scattered, and unite those you have brought together; look kindly on all who follow Jesus Christ, your Son; that we, who are consecrated by one baptism

into his life, death, and resurrection, may be joined together in the fullness of faith, and united in the fellowship of love;

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Let us pray to Almighty God, the creator of heaven and earth, for the whole of creation, through Jesus Christ, in whom all things were made, and through whom all things were reconciled to the Father, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his Cross.

Eternal God of unchanging power and light: look with mercy on your whole creation; and bring to completion your saving work, so that the whole world may see the fallen lifted up, the old made new, and all things brought to perfection by him through whom all things were made,

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Merciful Father, accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

THE SOLEMN ADORATION OF CHRIST CRUCIFIED

Please stand as the Cross is brought into the church in procession

This is the wood of the cross on which hung the Saviour of the world. **Come let us worship**

The Solemn Adoration (while organist plays) Were you there when they crucified my Lord?

THE HOLY COMMUNION

The Altar is dressed with cloth and a corporal put in place. Meanwhile the Presiding Priest brings the Sacrament back from the Altar of Repose to the altar while all stand in silence. (Acolytes) with lighted candles may accompany the Sacrament and place their candlesticks around the altar. Silence is kept during the administration of Holy Communion.

LORD'S PRAYER

As our Saviour has taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed he your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

AGNUS DEI

Jesus, Lamb of God: have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins: have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world: give us your peace.

We do not presume to come to this your table, merciful Lord trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table; but you are the same Lord, whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of you dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

COMMUNION

Communion is distributed in one kind. Organ music plays during Communion

After all have received, any remaining consecrated elements are consumed, and the candles are extinguished.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Almighty and eternal God, you have restored us to life by the triumphant death and resurrection of your Son, our Lord: continue his healing work within us, that by partaking of this mystery we may live ever dedicated to your service; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

FINAL PRAYER

May your abundant blessing, Lord, come down upon your people who have devoutly recalled the death of your Son, in the sure and certain hope of their resurrection: grant them pardon, bring them comfort, may their faith grow stronger, and their eternal salvation be assured; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
