


A Liturgy of the Word - Tenth Sunday after Pentecost 14 August 2022

For the community of St Michael's. We bring before you, heavenly Father, all those who belong to St Michael's, Bryanston, or who have connections to this parish. We thank you for the faithful departed who were part of this parish and to whom we are still joined spiritually. We thank-you for your continual faithfulness and provision. Inspire us to fulfil our calling as the Body of Christ in this place, that we would help establish your kingdom on earth.

For ourselves: Finally, Lord, we commit ourselves into your hands. Wherever we may be in the coming week, we ask you to meet us on our journeys.
