May this be an opportunity for us as a church to explore what our church treasures are and what our church can discard as baggage. Today we remember our annual Vestry meeting. Pray for all the newly elected church officers and PCC members that they will serve faithfully and effectively and find joy and satisfaction in their service. Lord in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Hear our prayer for all those who have been placed in authority over us. Give them strength, wisdom, and courage, so that they may carry out their many duties in the best interests of all our people and will serve with integrity and honour. We recognise the difficulties and challenges that they face and pray that they always remember that they are your servants, and that your Son came to serve rather than to be served. We pray for our country that division, conflict and strife would give way to unity, peace and quietness. Lord in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Loving God, comfort all who are in sorrow, need, sickness or any other adversity. We place into your gentle hands those who are sick. Ease their pain. We pray that they may be aware of your comforting presence and know that in your hands they are safe and loved. Be with them through the support of their friends, families, doctors and nurses and help them to be aware that they are surrounded with the prayers of the faithful. Lord in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Merciful God, we remember with thanksgiving before you those who have died in Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone. We remember those whose anniversary of their passing falls at this time and for the souls of all who have passed away recently. Be especially close to those they have left behind as they journey to the New Jerusalem. Comfort them in their sorrow. We pray for those who are worried about how they will cope on their own, reassure them that you will never leave them to carry the burdens of life unaided. Lord in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**



Faithful God, in the week that lies before us may we reflect your love in the way that we live our lives so that the world can see that we are followers of Christ and by our words and actions draw others into his loving care.

Merciful father: accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen
